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PREVENTION SERVICES

- Monthly Family Counselor/Educator sessions in Bremen & Plymouth to support families, caregivers, and children of loved ones needing treatment or recovery services
- Trauma training sessions for professional groups and community members
- Ongoing communication about SUD/ODD events throughout Michiana
- Access to naloxone training/resources and year-round drug take-back resources
- Evidence-based curriculum for intermediate/high school students and families
- Screening and support for individuals at-risk of developing substance use disorders

TREATMENT SERVICES

- Coordinated substance use services across clinics, hospitals and mental health providers
- Training for physicians, law enforcement, first responders and professionals who serve individuals experiencing SUD/ODD
- Public transit vouchers to transport individuals to SUD/ODD treatment and recovery services
- Telehealth equipment and technology updates
- Treatment Coordinator-Navigator to answer questions about services, help gain access to appropriate care, provide referrals/support, and advocate for individuals and their families

RECOVERY SERVICES

- Recovery Coordinator-Navigator works with individuals leaving in-patient facilities and the Marshall County Jail for 30-60 days after discharge or release. This position helps individuals recovering from SUD/ODD become connected with services (e.g., affordable housing, employment, transportation, therapy) to establish healthy and productive lifestyles
- Peer Recovery Coach is a role model, mentor and advocate in promoting long-term recovery
- Strengthening collaborative partnerships with agencies, organizations, churches, and David's Courage
